❖ Development of Education Management Information System (EMIS)

- Application of new approaches to managing academic programmes and office of academic affairs and registrar
- Development of indicators to monitor the performance of education system and to manage the distribution of educational resources and services



Contribution of the Project

❖ Development and dissemination of Training Kit as a support tool for RA HEIs to enable them:

- manage academic affairs based on student-centered principles
- revise their curricula in line with Bologna Guidelines
- develop and revise existing programmes in RA HEIs
- ensure the alignment of revised programmes with ECTS systems, legal and regulatory frameworks and guidelines on student-centred education



Contribution of the Project

❖ **Development and dissemination of Guideline for Guidelines for ECTS Users at RA HEIs (ECTS Guideline) as a guidance for RA HEIs which:**

- **provides a set of fundamental conceptual recommendations on the implementation of ECTS principles**
- **is addressed to the users at RA HEIs responsible for developing and advancing the functioning of ECTS and respective processes**
- **comprises new approaches approved in the ECTS Users' Guide endorsed by the Ministerial Conference (May 2015, Armenia)**



Contribution of the Project

❖ Conditions for Awarding Credits

- Learning outcomes (LOs) expressed in terms of competences are achieved.
- LOs should be expressed in terms of credits taking into account the notion of time needed by an average learner.
- Credits represent student workload.
- Credits and LOs expressed in terms of competences should be inseparably linked.
- Credits should express the volume of learning, LOs – content of learning.

Stages of ECTS application

**1. Module/Subject
(number of credits/student hours)**

4. Adjustment of unit either in regard to the number of credits allocated or the educational activities

2. Planning educational activities/determining student time involved

3. Checking of workload by student evaluations in terms of real time involved
